## Summary of Events, 32:1-35:29.

- **Chapter 32:1-21** Jacob prepares to meet Esau: 1-2, angels meet him; 3-6, messengers sent to Esau; 7-8, divides into two groups, expecting the worse; *read 9-12*, prayer; 13-21, arranges five groups of livestock as gifts to precede him.
- Chapter 32:22-32 (read) Jacob's encounter with God: 24, "a man wrestled with him;" 26, "unless you bless me;" 28, name change to Israel.



- Chapter 33:1-20 Jacob meets Esau: 1-2, women and children arranged in order; *read* 4, the meeting; 17-20, arrives at Succoth and Shechem.
- Chapter 34:1-31 rape and slaughter at Shechem.
- Chapter 35:1-15 "official sanction" at Bethel: 2-4, purification; *read* 9-13, God appears and speaks to Jacob; 14-15, naming of Bethel.
- Chapter 35:16-29 Family History: 16-20, Rachel dies in childbirth; 22, Reuben's immorality; 23-26, list of the 12 patriarchs of the nation of Israel; arrival at Mamre-home of Isaac, now, Abe, formerly; 28-29, Isaac dies at 180.
- A major lesson of the Old Testament is God's faithfulness. The word "lovingkindness" means: faithfulness, goodness, graciousness Halot; goodness, kindness BDB. The concept of God's unconditional love awaits the person, faithfully promised in the Old Testament in Genesis and elsewhere, to demonstrate it, the Lord Jesus Christ.
